



From them will proceed thanksgiving; And the voice of those who celebrate; And I will multiply them and they will not be diminished; I will also honor them and they will not be insignificant.

—Jeremiah 30:19

Rodney Williams recounted how fifty years ago he sat in a pew on the right side of the Camargo Camp Ground Tabernacle. He reached for his wife

Eva's hand. Together they walked to the altar. Kneeling down at the front of the wood frame building, he and Eva gave their life, marriage, and trust to Jesus Christ. Williams was not the first, nor was he the last to be saved on those grounds. He is a member of the long line of those the Holy Spirit moved from their seat to their knees. It's a place where countless tears have been shed, healings have taken place, memo-ries have been made, lives have been changed. It's a place that is cause for reason to rejoice.

Since the 1930s when W.F. Chapel invited Jay Harmon to take the podium of the tabernacle on the Camargo campgrounds, this annual event has become a staple for the Church of God. Now decades later the faithful have gathered for another week long embrace of God's Word being proclaimed boldly and with courage. Now simply and enduringly known as just Camargo. Yearly, God's people have gathered on the grounds while the appointed have challenged those in the pews with a charge to keep. *"I solemnly charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by His appearing and His kingdom" (2 Timothy 4:1)*

Camargo Camp Meeting 2009 provided one for the books. Speaker Mark Jackson, pastor of Larchmont Church of God in Louisville, KY, stood ready, willing, and able for the proclamation of truth. Along side the always unique Rodney Williams, who lead worship and prepared the way for the preached word. As well, services for teenagers lead by Mike Sexton, and kid's camp under the leadership of Elaine Rice, made the evenings well rounded for the whole family. However, camp meeting was more than a couple hours each night, this event took full advantage of the daylight hours too. From morning conferences lead by Mark Jackson, Jeff Justice, and Damon Curtis; to area ministers preaching each afternoon. The day was jam packed for Kingdom edification. Camargo Camp Ground Chairman and Pastor, Frank Curtis proclaimed, "The week was a great time of spiritual growth with people and pastors encouraged. There were many victories throughout the week."

This giant of a meeting not only provided preaching, song, lesson, fellowship, salvation, and healing; but took a step to promote evangelism. A love offering was taken up along with word of mouth throughout the week. When a final tally came in, \$8235.00 was presented to Clay County First Church of God visionary planter Walter Strong to help support the work in Manchester.

Camargo once again proved worth the venture with rousing Biblically sound messages, elevated worship hymns, moving special songs, and stirring altar calls. Each piece reminding us that the story, purpose, and reason behind Camargo Camp Meeting is to expand the Kingdom of God. It's the message proclaimed by Jay Harmon, and the many messages by various speakers over the years. It's why Frank Curtis stands in the gap and invests time and energy to continue the heritage that is Camargo. It's for this Kingdom that Mark Jackson, great-great-great-great-grandson of W.F. Chapel, opened the Word of God with passion and power. It's by the calling of God's Kingdom through this meeting that brought Rodney and Eva Williams to the their knees for salvation. It's the same reason so many have gathered in the white frame tabernacle at Camargo. *"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful; and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:23-25)*

This year Junior Moore found that story, purpose, and reason. Making his way into the building that night he took his place in the pew and sat back to hear his grandson preach. Speaker Mark Jackson took the pulpit with determination. Moore's grandson was about to be the mouth piece of God that would bring about the need to make the move for salvation. As rejoicing filled the room, Pastor Mark brought his grand-father to the throne of God. Camargo Camp Meeting rejoiced again. It's for this we are blessed; it's for this we praise God. It's for this we simply say, thank you once again, Camargo!

Highlights From Camargo Camp Meeting 2009























"A Pearl Of Great Price" Richard M. Bradley

Jesus speaking of the Kingdom of God likened it to a man seeking goodly pearls and finding one of great value.

Matt 13:45-46

.....when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it. KJV

We have a goodly pearl and one of great price right in our midst today, but seemingly many folks are oblivious of its presence or value. I speak of that goodly pearl known as "*Camp Meeting*".

Many view "camp meeting" as a phenomenon of American frontier Christianity. Thousands of persons were attracted to these meetings on the

frontiers where there were few churches and even fewer preachers. The "camp meeting" filled a real need in what was in the 1800's a religious vacuum. Due to limited modes of transportation and the distances involved is was not feasible to travel back and forth from homes to the meeting. Because of these barriers it necessitated people leaving home for the entire duration of the meeting and camping out at or near the site.

There, freed from their daily routines for the duration of the meeting, the participants engaged is what was almost continuous services. Once one speaker was finished another would rise to take his place. "Camp Meetings" were especially an integral part of the early Holiness Movement. It was out of this movement, heralding godliness of living, that the Reformation Movement of the Church of God had its beginning. The "camp meeting" concept was a carry-over when Daniel Sidney Warner took his walk away from sectism and denominationalism and took his stand for Unity, Holiness, and the unique entity of the Church, the Bride of Christ.

In the ensuing years of the Reformation Movement of the church of God "Camp Meeting" locally and nationally was the glue that held the Movement on course and bound it together. The "camp meeting" platform provided a wonderful venue for clear doctrinal declaration, wonderful music and hymn singing with strong oral, improvisatory, and spontaneous elements. Both tunes and words were created, changed, and adapted in true folk music fashion. Strong doctrinal themes and content became a hallmark of "camp meeting" singing.


As I said at the outset of this article, most people believe that "camp meeting" was an early American thing, a pioneer thing. However that belief is not entirely true, for "camp meeting" has always been a "God Thing" ! God, Himself, is the originator of "camp meeting". You can read the "camp meeting command" in Deuteronomy 16:11 – 15. There God gives instruction for the Feast of Booths and sets it in perpetuity. To date God has not rescinded that command! It needs to continue to be an integral part of the church calendar and activity. It teaches us a multitude of valuable lessons in regard to our relationships and responsibilities to one another in the body of Christ.


Pray for "camp meeting", support "camp meeting", and most importantly attend and participate in "camp meeting." I place heavy emphasis on "CAMP" meeting.
