




## New East District Online Home Coming Soon

## "A Pearl Of Great Price" Richard M. Bradley

Jesus speaking of the Kingdom of God likened it to a man seeking goodly pearls and finding one of great value.

Matt 13:45-46

.....when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it. KJV

We have a goodly pearl and one of great price right in our midst today, but seemingly many folks are oblivious of its presence or value. I speak of that goodly pearl known as **"Camp Meeting"**.

Many view "camp meeting" as a phenomenon of American frontier Christianity. Thousands of persons were attracted to these meetings on the

frontiers where there were few churches and even fewer preachers. The "camp meeting" filled a real need in what was in the 1800's a religious vacuum. Due to limited modes of transportation and the distances involved is was not feasible to travel back and forth from homes to the meeting. Because of these barriers it necessitated people leaving home for the entire duration of the meeting and camping out at or near the site.

There, freed from their daily routines for the duration of the meeting, the participants engaged is what was almost continuous services. Once one speaker was finished another would rise to take his place. "Camp Meetings" were especially an integral part of the early Holiness Movement. It was out of this movement, heralding godliness of living, that the Reformation Movement of the Church of God had its beginning. The "camp meeting" concept was a carry-over when Daniel Sidney Warner took his walk away from sectism and denominationalism and took his stand for Unity, Holiness, and the unique entity of the Church, the Bride of Christ.

In the ensuing years of the Reformation Movement of the church of God "Camp Meeting" locally and nationally was the glue that held the Movement on course and bound it together. The "camp meeting" platform provided a wonderful venue for clear doctrinal declaration, wonderful music and hymn singing with strong oral, improvisatory, and spontaneous elements. Both tunes and words were created, changed, and adapted in true folk music fashion. Strong doctrinal themes and content became a hallmark of "camp meeting" singing.

As I said at the outset of this article, most people believe that "camp meeting" was an early American thing, a pioneer thing. However that belief is not entirely true, for "camp meeting" has always been a "God Thing" ! God, Himself, is the originator of "camp meeting". You can read the "camp meeting command" in Deuteronomy 16:11 – 15. There God gives instruction for the Feast of Booths and sets it in perpetuity. To date God has not rescinded that command! It needs to continue to be an integral part of the church calendar and activity. It teaches us a multitude of valuable lessons in regard to our relationships and responsibilities to one another in the body of Christ.

Pray for "camp meeting", support "camp meeting", and most importantly attend and participate in "camp meeting." I place heavy emphasis on "CAMP" meeting.



## Year Book Registration

Dear Pastor and/or Congregational Leader,

I pray this letter finds you well and being blessed of the Lord. The purpose of this letter is to encourage you to be aware of the fact that it is the time of year we are being asked to register as ministers and congregations with the Church of God by our national office. Last year 31 congregations in Kentucky failed to register. Failing to register puts your congregation at great risk. Every congregation and minister that registers automatically falls under the 501(c) (3) umbrella of Church of God Ministries. This affords every congregation registered tax exempt status for federal, state, and local purposes. Failing to register in essence removes you from tax exempt status unless you file and pay for individual exemption with the State of Ken-Reg. 2 Representative tucky. If you are not covered under a 501 (c) (3) it means your members cannot claim their giving to the church as a deduction on their taxes. It also means you can

not legally deduct sales tax from purchases you make for the church. This has nothing to do with National or State Ministry. This is the Federal Law.

The goal of our East District Leadership Team is to have 100% of our congregations registered. This will afford you the tax protection you deserve and your members' desire. Registering also says, "We are a part of the Church of God Reformation Movement" which gives you a voice in the matters of the Church and as I always remind you every voice is important and deserves to be heard.

You may register online if you have access to a computer. Simply log onto www.chog.org/ AnnualReg and follow the instructions. You will need a Master Card, VISA or Discover Card to pay for your registration. If you chose not to register online printed forms will be mailed by our national office in mid-June. If you do not receive a registration form by the end of June please call our State Ministry Office at 859-335-9264 and they can provide you with both ministerial and congregational forms. If you would like help in filling out the forms please call me at 606-615-3046 or Jeff Justice at 606-424-0695 and we will see that someone is able to help you with this task. Also, if the cost of registration is a financial hardship for your congregation the East District will assist you in meeting this financial obligation.

Our dream and our goal is to see the Church of God in Kentucky united and standing as One Body in Christ. Our State Pastor, Randy Montgomery, and our East District Leadership Team want you to know we love you and we want to be a blessing and a help to you. Brother Randy will have all of the necessary forms you will need if you don't receive them in June and some of us in the East District have pledged to be the hands and feet to assist in this matter. The IRS has made it plain they are going to be more intentional in their pursuit of churches that do not conform to federal tax laws. We want to make sure none of our conaregations are investigated.

If you have any questions concerning this matter please let me know. If I don't know the answer I will find someone who does.

Dear Members of the East District,

Over the last two years we have accomplished much in regard to Camp Lyons. With your help, new carpet was put into the Ashland House, the road was repaired and graveled, pressing financial debts were alleviated and money was raised for some badly needed repairs.

In visiting the camp this past week with the campgrounds board and members of the task force, I became aware as did the others of the need for general maintenance and repairs to be made on the cabins. This would include cleaning, painting, repairs to doors and windows and roof replacement on some. To meet this need, the campgrounds board has authorized the task force to promote an "ADOPT A CABIN" program such as one instituted several years ago wherein a church, or in some cases churches in partnership with one another, would select a cabin and do all the necessary repairs.

Let me encourage your church to consider adopting a cabin and continuing the upward progress that is being made at the camp. With a little tender love and care, Camp Lyons can be one of the most beautiful and functional ministries of the Church of God in Kentucky or, in fact, the nation!

We are not asking for a lot of money. What we are asking for is your time, effort, energy, and talent to be put into a camp that is dedicated to doing the work of the Kingdom of God in Kentucky. Could I suggest that you pick a day, bring capable men, women, boys and girls to the camp, choose a cabin, determine what you will need to fix it up and then determine when you can do it in correlation with the ongoing activities of the camp. You could have a church picnic day at the camp and make it a total church event. And, the campgrounds board will permit each participating churches to put a plaque on their cabin acknowledging their adoption.


