As a result of these factors I follow the activities of the Wolfe County and Powell County search and rescue squads. The people who serve on these squads are heroes in my book. They give their time and risk life and limb to seek and to save those who are lost. They retrieve lost hikers and sometimes even deceased hikers from remote and often dangerous locations because they care.

In Luke 19:10 Jesus said, "For the son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost."

Jesus was on a search and rescue mission. He laid down his life to save the lost. He came to this world to seek out the lost and to rescue the injured. He did not come as a conquering, liberating leader but as a rescue worker. He did not promote violence. He did promote love and compassion.

AN OFFERING MOST HOLY

Leviticus 6:24-29 Part 1



The Law of the Sin Offering

24 Also the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, 25 "Speak to Aaron and to his sons, saying, 'This is the law of the sin offering: In the place where the burnt offering is killed, the sin offering shall be killed before the Lord. It is most holy. 26 The priest who offers it for sin shall eat it. In a holy place it shall be eaten, in the court of the tabernacle of meeting. 27 Everyone who touches its flesh [a]must be holy. And when its blood is sprinkled on any garment, you shall wash that on which it was sprinkled, in a holy place. 28 But the earthen vessel in which it is boiled shall be broken. And if it is boiled in a bronze pot, it shall be both scoured and rinsed in water. 29 All the males among the priests may eat it. It is most holy.

The days of the Old Covenant were shadowy times, days of vague forms of great truths and promises, but indistinct in the lesser light of that limited revelation. The shadows of that time were cast by the light of God's radiance falling across themes then only prophetic but certain to come pass in awesome and solid reality. In chapter 6 of Leviticus is the instruction of that covenant regarding the sin offering.

The sin offering was presented by the people to the priesthood, who in turn made a sacrifice of it to the Lord at the brazen altar of the tabernacle. That which was offered for sin was considered holy. Its very blood was holy. It could only be handled by holy men, who after offering it sat down in a holy place to eat the flesh of the offering. Twice in the passage the priests were reminded of the gravity of handling and consuming the sin offering with these words: "it is most holy."

The shadow of the sin offering is cast by the light of revelation falling upon the great cross of the Lord Jesus Christ. The cross is of such power and is so central to the working of God's grace that even the shadow of it in the former days was the most holy thing the people of that time ever came within view of. When the priests had offered the sin offering and sat down in the court of the priests to consume its flesh, stopping first to destroy any vessel used to cook it, no person outside their number could approach them. All the men of Israel and their families might look on, but they could not approach the table at which those priests sat.

Any child with his father who happened to see that meal being taken by the priests might ask, "Father, why can't we eat with the priests? That meat smells good and I'm hungry. Can I have some?" His father's response would be a disappointment. "I'm sorry, but neither you nor I can eat any of what those priests are having." "But why?" "Because it is most holy."

The New Testament is not without its shadows and symbols. The difference is that the shadows we see are often cast forward rather than backward, coming from sacred history we already know in detail rather than prophetic things yet to be seen.

The Apostle Paul reflected on these symbols when he reminded the church at Corinth about right conduct at the Lord's Supper. It was vitally important that they understand the gravity of what the Lord's Supper is. Simply, the bread and the cup at the heart of our fellowship are the most holy things we encounter in the world. They are holy because of what they represent. If the sin offering of the lesser covenant was sacred beyond measure because of what it represented, how much more sacred are the bread and cup of the New Testament church, pointing to the same sacrifice in all its saving glory?

AN OFFERING MOST HOLY

1 Corinthians 11:23-26



Institution of the Lord's Supper

23 For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; 24 and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, [a]"Take, eat; this is My body which is [b]broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." 25 In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." 26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes. (1 Corinthians 11:23-26)

As we sit together with the bread and cup before us, let us take the time to reflect on the holiness of what we do. What we handle is the most sacred objects we ever hold or taste. Not because they literally become the body and blood of our Lord, but because they speak so powerfully of that great sacrifice by which we and the whole kingdom of God are saved.

Friends, how is it that we have fallen into the habit within the church of God of celebrating the Lord's Supper so infrequently? In many of our congregations, this bread and cup are received only once or twice year. In some, the practice seems to have fallen away completely. In the end, there is no absolute rule that prescribes how often the church should observe this mighty ordinance, but what might the Holy Spirit deem right, bearing in mind the holiness of this occasion? Didn't Paul say that eating this bread and drinking this cup were their own powerful proclamation of the Lord's death? Does it not then seem appropriate to keep this expression before the people of God and the world more regularly?

Some have said that it isn't necessary to observe this Supper often because it is only a symbol. Such an attitude is shortsighted and crude. When symbols are given us by the Lord and declared in His word to be sacred, they will never be only a symbol.

Others take the opposite track. They claim they practice the Lord's Supper infrequently because they fear losing it as an act of worship. "If we do it too often," they say, "our people will lose the glory of it." One wonders if they feel the same about the preaching of the word or receiving tithes and offerings.

No, friends, let us do this often. Let us include the families within the church, reminding them that they are saved by the Lord's sacrifice. Let the children take the bread and cup, knowing that they will spill some on the pews and won't completely understand what they're doing. Maybe they'll ask questions in the middle of it. Questions that shouldn't be shushed but answered. "Why are we doing this? Why do I have a little cup and piece of bread? Why do I get to be included?" And a father can look down and say, "Because it is most holy. Now eat up!"
