

GOD IS ABLE

We live in a day and age that seems to constantly bombard us with bad news of one sort or another. It amazes me how many people are struggling with genuine life issues of often time's life and death consequences. My wife and I recently got away for a weekend to celebrate our anniversary. We decided to visit one of our former pastorates in another state. We learned shortly after our arrival into town that one of the longtime members of the congregation had just been diagnosed with cancer and has but a short time to live. In the morning worship service the pastor asked that anyone who had cancer or had a family member or friend who had cancer to come forward for a special time of prayer. Nearly every person in the sanctuary went forward. This is truly a sign of the time we live in.

If one would allow themselves to dwell upon the bad news of this world it would be very easy to become depressed to the degree that you would question why you should even get out of bed in the mornings! But I want to remind you of the fact we have a hope in someone that is still able to do exceeding, abundantly above all that we might ask or think. You know that someone as I do to be Jesus Christ.

Allow me to remind you of the story of feeding the 5000 as it is recorded for us in Matthew 14: 14-18. The disciples were given the daunting task of feeding 5000 men besides women and children and they only had five small loaves of bread and two fish as a visible resource with which to meet this great need. You talk about an overwhelming challenge, they indeed faced one! Left to themselves there was no way they could meet the need that confronted them!!!

When was the last time you were confronted with an overwhelming, seemingly impossible, challenge? One in which you were woefully inadequate to meet. What did you do? I am sure you prayed! How did that work out for you? Before you give too quick of an answer let me remind you that you are still alive and able to read this. In that respect God made a way or perhaps He is still working on your particular situation.

All of us are faced with challenges beyond our means from time to time but as Christians we have a resource the world does not acknowledge: we have Jesus! The Apostle Paul reminds us in Philippians 4: 19 "But our God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." In Christ we have the resource to meet our every need.

In Jesus the disciples had an inexhaustible resource. Jesus instructed the disciples to bring Him the loaves and fishes and by His mighty power every person in that great crowd was filled to the full and there were even left-overs! Through this great miracle Jesus proved once again there is no need in our lives so big that God can not meet it.

If you have some great need in your life I urge you to **really pray** and combine your prayer with **fasting.**

Secondly I encourage you to genuinely **trust God** with your need and stop trying to solve it yourself. You will only muddle things up.

Finally **be patient** and give God time to work. In His time and in His way He will show up for He is able!

As a way to encourage others I would urge you to email our District Chairman, Jeff Justice, with your testimony of answered prayer. Hopefully we will have room from time to time to print some of these accounts. Who knows, your story might be the very one someone else needs to hear.
